



Zimbabwe Parks and Wildlife Matobo National Park Rules and Regulations

DO's and DON'T's

As provided for by the Parks and Wildlife Act Chapter 20:14 and its subsidiary legislation, in particular SI 362 of 1990 (Parks and Wildlife General Regulations), your attention is drawn to the following regulations and guidelines:

1. The Park opens at 0600hrs and closes at 1800hrs.
2. Do not Litter. Throwing away empty bottles, tins and waste is prohibited and is an offence.
3. Do not cause veld fires. All fires lit should be controlled and properly extinguished after use. No fires should be left unattended.
4. It is a serious offence to damage any rock art or archaeological deposit.
5. Do not cause any noise or play music which can be a nuisance to other guests or to the general environment.
6. Do not feed any wild animals.
7. Domesticated animals or pets are not allowed in the Park.
8. All animals in the Park are potentially dangerous, please treat them with caution and respect.
9. Commercial filming in the Park requires a Permit and prior authorisation by the Director General or his appointee.
10. When driving through the Park, only designated and prescribed roads may be used. Do not drive on exposed rock (dwalas).
11. Possession of any weapon, poison or any explosive is not allowed.
12. Collection of any wood, flora, soil or mineral is prohibited.
13. The check in time for use of accommodation facilities is 1000hrs. Any loss or damage to equipment, furniture or fittings in any facility is to be either restored, replaced or paid for.
14. Any queries should be directed to any Parks employees manning entry points or offices.

NB: The listed items only serve as a general guide on the conduct expected within a National Park and the list may not be exhaustive. You are encouraged to familiarise yourself with the Parks and Wildlife Act and other related Statutory Instruments. More information can be found on our website.
